# **NEWSLINES**

#### **SWITZERLAND**

As reported last month, journeys on the *Golden Pass Express* service between Montreux and Interlaken will require a change of trains at Zweisimmen until June 10 owing to technical issues. However, through journeys are expected to be restored from June 11 with four services operating in each direction (Tables **563** and **566**).

#### **SPAIN**

From April 24, Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat de Catalunya (FGC) introduced additional services between Lleida and La Pobla de Segur (Table 662)

As mentioned last month, low-cost high-speed operator *Avlo* will introduce one service in each direction on the Madrid – Sevilla and Madrid – Málaga routes from June 1 (Table **660**).

Just as we were finalising this month's edition, we received advice that services using the high-speed line between Madrid and Sevilla will be affected by planned engineering work from June 1. During the work, journey times will be extended (meaning earlier departure times and later arrivals) and certain services will not run. Full details will be published in the Summer 2023 edition.

Following the recent withdrawal of the rail replacement bus service between Aranjuez and Utiel via Cuenca, we have decided to remove Table 669 altogether.

## **GERMANY**

Timings in the German section are currently valid until May 26 and include amended schedules following the temporary closure, from April 1, of the high-speed line between Kassel and Fulda. Readers should note that the line between Würzburg and Nürnberg will also be closed during the summer, from May 27 to September 11, resulting in further timing changes. The German section will be fully updated in time for the Summer edition with amended schedules for this period.

Work to upgrade the Elleringhauser Tunnel, located west of Brilon Wald station, will affect services in Table 804 from May 4 to August 25. During this period buses will replace trains between Bestwig and Brilon Wald resulting in extended journey times. A special version of Table 804 will be found on page 560 with the amended schedules.

All long-distance trains between Berlin and Dresden are diverted until November 10 as the latest phase of work to upgrade this important route is undertaken (Table 840). During this period, a reduced service is operating with extended journey times. Most services on the Rostock – Berlin – Dresden route do not run south of Flughafen Berlin. However, the two daily through services in each direction between Berlin and Chemnitz continue to run, albeit diverted via Riesa and so not serving Dresden. Table 835 has also been updated with the amended regional service on the Berlin to Elsterwerda route which is partially operated by bus.

Through rail services between Gerolstein and Trier were restored from April 17, nearly two years after the line was severely damaged by flooding in the summer of 2021. Services between Gerolstein and Kall continue to be operated by bus for the time being, but this section of line is also expected to reopen later this year when through rail services will return along the whole route from Köln to Trier via Gerolstein. Table 915a has been updated with the latest timings.

#### **POLAND**

Engineering work is affecting services between Szczecin and Białogard with buses replacing trains on certain dates (Table 1015).

#### TURKFY

Regional rail services between Sivas and Samsun were due to be reinstated from April 27 after a gap of nearly eight years. Originally constructed between 1924 and 1931, the whole route was closed from 2015 to 2020 to allow major upgrade work to take place. As the official announcement was only made shortly before our press deadline, and with intermediate timings not confirmed, we have not been able to update Table 1577. However, trains are expected to run from Sivas on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays at 0840 and 1637, returning from Samsun on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays at 0835 and 1643. These trains should provide good connections with services using the new high-speed line between Ankara and Sivas which is expected to open soon. In fact, some reports indicate that the new high-speed line may have opened by the time this edition is published. We plan to fully update the Turkish section in the Summer edition to include the latest confirmed schedules.

### **LITHUANIA**

Local services around Šiauliai on Table 1805 have been recast so that most trains run Panevežys – Šiauliai – Mažeikiai. Please be aware that this table continues to be subject to alteration due to ongoing electrification work, especially Tuesdays to Saturdays, so all timings should be confirmed locally.

### **BEYOND EUROPE UPDATE**

International services between China and Laos started on Thursday April 13. Table **7120** from the Beyond Europe section is reproduced below.

Daily through Pacific Surfliner services between Los Angeles and San Diego resumed on April 17. Services were suspended in late 2022 as the route required emergency engineering work in the San Clemente area. A weekend service was reintroduced in February.
